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ACTION TAKEN REPORT (Academic Year 2024- 2025)

Students Feedback:

The students are satisfied with the Competency Based Medical Education (CBME). They felt that the transition to this curriculum has helped improve the quality of medical education. They were happy regarding the continuing feedback sessions and the intentions to resolve their issues. Some points worthy of mention are:

- More exposure to OSCE
- Opportunities for research
- Appreciated the initiation of the institutional clubs
- Need for avenues to safeguard the mental health in the curriculum
- Continuation of Add-on and value-added courses

Actions Taken:

- It was decided to continue the clubs (Literary, Scientific, Arts, Dance, Music etc.) for the students to help them pursue their field of interest (curricular/ extra-curricular) to aid their holistic growth.
- A list of topics for this year's add-on and value-added-courses were finalised in the curriculum committee meeting as follows:

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ACTION TAKEN REPORT (Academic Year 2024-2025)

Faculty Feedback:


The faculty were majorly satisfied with the curriculum. They welcomed the change of the assessment pattern with the inclusion of OSCE.

Some of the points raised by the faculty were:

- Faculty expressed the need for frequent faculty training programs- BCME and CISP.
- Some also brought up the need for certain journals in their departments and central library.
- Many faculty expressed the trepidation that the change in the assessment system namely the 40/60 marks in theory/ practicals would be detrimental to the future of medical education.

Actions Taken:

- The MEU has received the NMC approval to conduct BCME and CISP-III in the college under the aegis of the Nodal Centre.
- The departments have been instructed to send a list of required books/ journals to the library for the necessary action.
- The opinions of the faculty regarding the assessment will passed on to the relevant authorities from our institution.



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ACTION TAKEN REPORT (Academic Year 2024- 2025)

Alumni Feedback:

Many of the alumni are now well placed professionally and appreciated the institution's role in their academic growth. They also had a few suggestions to offer about the curriculum.

- The need for earlier sensitisation and awareness about post MBBS career aspects.
- Curriculum needs to be supported by other means to cater to the growth of a person as a whole

Actions Taken:

- It was decided to continue the add-on and value-added courses and incorporate self-defence classes, continue career aspects and yoga, mindfulness classes.
- It has been decided to implement actions to promote mental health of the students.

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ACTION TAKEN REPORT (Academic Year 2024- 2025)

Employers Feedback:

Many of the alumni are now working at other hospitals and their employers were asked to give their opinions on the curriculum. They mentioned that though the CBME curriculum has been a good change, a few points still needed attention:

- Some felt that more emphasis is needed in honing the doctors with respect to managing the pressures of the work environment.
- They felt that the exposure given to the doctors via skill labs is commendable and expressed their desire that more competencies be trained using the same.

Actions Taken:

- It was decided to amp up the faculty development programs to give all a sensitization about the Simulation labs, so that they can train the students better.
- It was decided to continue the value-added-courses to equip the students with the necessary values to enhance their curricular experience.



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ACTION TAKEN REPORT (Academic Year 2024-2025)

Professionals' Feedback:

Curricular feedback was taken from the external examiners visiting the college. Though most were satisfied with the curriculum, and expressed their joy at inclusion of OSCE in the clinical examination, they raised the following concerns:

- They mentioned the need for all the faculty to be trained in OSCEpreparation and conduct.
- They also felt that the OSCE question bank needs to be maintained and updated with each coming year
- They also stressed upon the fact that OSCE should not remain a glorified spotters but needs to evolve in a way that can be used as an assessment tool for all domains.
- They also shared the view that the marking in the new assessment pattern could hamper the quality of medical education

Actions Taken:

- It was decided that the frequency of FDP for OSCE training would be increased.
- All departments have been advised to prepare their OSCE banks and maintain it in the department.
- Due representation of the doctors' opinions would be given to to the KNRUHS.



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
